School Leadership Messages

Covid Update: New guidance

New guidance for schools was issued by the DfE on January 19th.

- From 11 January a positive lateral flow test for students with no symptoms does not need to be confirmed by a positive PCR (there are exceptions, please see the Government guidance).
- From Monday 17 January, people who are self-isolating with COVID-19 will have the option to reduce their isolation period after 5 full days if they test negative with a lateral flow device (LFD) test on both day 5 and day 6 and they do not have a temperature.
- Positive lateral flow tests must be reported to the NHS so that normal track and trace procedures can be followed.
- We will continue to supply packs of 7 LFTs to our students. Please continue to test at home twice-weekly.
- Anyone over the age of 18 years and 6 months who is not vaccinated, must isolate in line with government guidelines if they are a close contact of a positive case.

Very close contacts

Students (from reception age or above) who live with someone who has tested positive for COVID-19, should take an LFD test every day for 7 days: testing should start from when the first person in the home tests positive as household transmission is very likely to happen. If at any time the student becomes symptomatic, they must stay at home and arrange for a PCR test immediately (regardless of having already had a negative PCR test result).

Face coverings

We are anticipated cases to rise as a result of Thursday's relaxation of Covid rules so we are requesting students to continue to wear masks in the communal areas and assemblies so that we can continue to keep each other safe and students in school.

Co-Headteachers

Weekly Roundup

We have no doubt that Year 11 students will be pleased to see their mock examination period drawing to a close this week. Students have conducted themselves exceptionally well throughout this period. We know they will now be looking forward to the opportunity to reflect on how they did in the coming weeks to ensure they are clear on what they still need to learn and improve on in time for the summer exam series.

Now that plan B measures have ceased we are keen that we don't abandon many of the behaviours we have developed during the pandemic too soon. While we may no longer insist on mask wearing, it is clear from not just the national pictures but also locally and at Fortismere we are still seeing very high numbers of covid positive cases. Therefore we are still very much recommending that masks continue to be worn by our students and staff in communal areas at school. We talk a lot to our students about how our behaviour can have a significant impact on the safety of those we



work with as exemplified in our Fortismere Four rule, 'Be safe'. While there is a general acceptance that the current variant of Covid is less severe, there are still those connected to our community who could become unwell if exposed to the virus. Furthermore, while self-isolation is still a requirement for those who test positive this will continue to have an impact on the students and staff attendance. Students have missed enough face-to face learning in the last couple of years; we will do whatever we can to ensure they are in school with us. We would ask that parents discuss the importance of continuing covid-safe behaviours, including masks wearing until levels of the virus in the community drop further.

We were moved to see events taking place across the country yesterday to mark Holocaust Memorial Day. At this time of the year at Fortismere we pause to reflect on this period of history, to remember the millions of lives lost and to make sure we take every opportunity to understand how we can learn lessons from the past. Ms Fineberg has delivered assemblies to offer this reflection that are being delivered across our Year groups so students from all backgrounds have the opportunity to think and respond together.

We seem to have arrived at the end of January rather swiftly. We wish all of our students and their families a peaceful weekend.

Next week parents will receive an email via ParentMail with a form for students to choose their preferred language(s). Students will be given a choice of language combination and in the event of oversubscription for the double language groups we will use the results of the tests undertaken in Spanish, French and Mandarin as a cut-off point. Other factors will be taken into consideration when groups are decided, such as teacher assessment of pupils' progress, homework and attitude to learning.

Year 9 - Options

Last Friday all Year 9s had an exciting day learning about all their possible options. We had some exceptional Year 10s and Year 12s helping in the ML stall sharing their passion for languages with them and we truly thank them for that!

A few questions have arisen from that day and from the DLCs. Please read these **FAQs**:

-My child speaks another language at home - can they take GCSE in that language? Yes, students will be able to take a GCSE in their home language. Occasionally we can't always provide every language so if you want to double check, please email Ms Robson on rrobson@fortismere.org.uk



- My child wants to take GCSE in their home language, will this count as an option? No, students that take a GCSE in their home language will have an extra GCSE and they still have to choose 4 options in the options process.
- My child speaks and understands another language but doesn't necessarily write it well. Can they take a GCSE? We recommend those students to go over some past papers from the exam board and/or to have some tuition to enhance those skills in order to achieve a high grade.
- My child wants to do Spanish as a GCSE but we speak French and wants to do the GCSE independently. Is this allowed? Yes, students can do a language as one of their options and take an extra GCSE independently in their home language.
- Can the students take a GCSE independently in yr 10? Yes they can given that we do not have more disruptions with exams due to COVID.
