Covid Update: Public Health Haringey

- 1. From 1 April, anyone with a positive COVID-19 test result will be advised to try to stay at home and avoid contact with other people.
 - a. In adults this is for for five days,
 - b. For children and young people aged 18 and under, the advice will be three days.
- 2. As tests will no longer readily be available, children and young people who are unwell and have a high temperature should stay at home and avoid contact with other people. They can go back to school, college or childcare when they no longer have a high temperature, and they are well enough to attend
- 3. Regular asymptomatic testing is no longer recommended in any education or childcare setting, including in SEND, alternative provision and children's social care settings. Therefore, settings will no longer be able to order test kits.

Weekly Roundup

Welcome back to the Summer Term at Fortismere. The weather definitely suited the occasion and we are continuing with our policy of expecting students to spend break and lunch time outdoors. As it can still be chilly despite the sun, please could we ask parents and carers to ensure that students are dressed appropriately.

A growing area of concern for us (and a focus for action this term) has been the increased attractiveness of vaping to some of our young people. Vapes seem to be deliberately designed to look appealing to children and young people and we have been dealing with an increased number of vaping incidents, particularly amongst our younger students. Please could we ask parents and carers to keep an eye on what students may be bringing into school. We will continue to work with the police to ensure that vapes are not being sold to underage students anywhere locally. As you can see from the OWL attachment, the police are keen to work with us as a local community. We are also continuing with random bag searches and confiscations of prohibited items, including smart phones alongside vapes. This week we also uncovered a ring of would-be firecracker users in Y7, there was much contrition all round!

Today is Stephen Lawrence Day when we commemorate his death at the hands of racists. It seems very much in keeping with that terrible event that the Drama Department hosted a Y12 performance yesterday, on the 1936 Battle of Cable Street. This powerful production focused on the story of two girls growing up in London's Jewish east end in the 1930s. In exploring the impact of fascism and racism, the topic feels both timely and relevant.



Next week sees International Evening (Tuesday 26/4), a fundraising event where all the money raised will go to CanDo; a humanitarian charity that supports those in war devastated areas. In addition to speakers, our students will be showcasing their wide range of talents and we are very much looking forward to seeing our students perform.

Fortismere is partially closed this morning to allow departments to moderate students' exam work and to enable focused revision and exam practice for Y11 and a mixture of study and revision sessions for Y13. As we head towards the start of formal exams, Fortismere will be offering more exam support opportunities for both the exam year groups and also for targeted groups, individuals and subject areas.

The cherry blossoms are beginning to fall so this weekend will offer one of the last chances to catch the trees in all their splendour; we would recommend Cranley Gardens for a stroll. We wish all our families a lovely weekend.


Author Visit

Friday 22nd April is Earth Day. There are so many brilliant, powerful and hopeful books in our library to inspire you to care for our planet.

























Cable Street - Year 12 Production Thursday 22 April

It was once again wonderful to invite audiences into the North Wing Hall to watch live theatre. This is something we have really missed over the past few years. Last night parents were delighted to watch the first preview of the Year 12 production Cable Street and we are thankful for their support for this community piece.

Ms Overs, the Head of Drama, along with several cast members have family connections to the battle of Cable Street, so this story felt even more poignant to tell. Cable Street was written by Lisa Goldman as part of the National Theatre Connections programme, something the Drama department has taken part in this year. The A-level drama students were able to use the rights for this fascinating play as part of their exam work.

Cable Street tells the story of two girls growing up in London's Jewish east end in the 1930s. Leah and Kitty are blood sisters, best friends and more... but they get caught up in the political turmoil caused by Oswald Mosley's fascist Blackshirts.

Yeah 12 were lucky enough to be able to zoom the playwright and are also hoping she will see the show next week. She recently wrote to us saying "politics can also tear people apart, particularly the politics of hate. Leah's central dilemma personally and politically is that In loving you, I have to stop loving myself. So I grew up with this family history, but many people have never heard of the Battle of Cable Street - the greatest ever victory over British fascism. That is one of the things that makes this play important -to remember those events and relate them to the events of now. Another thing – I think I'm right in saying - is that this is the first female written/female centred play and the first queer love story about the Battle of Cable Street. So this play is very close to my heart - more than any play I've written before. I thank you for taking it into your hearts and for all your hard work in bringing it to life. I hope you've learnt loads about yourself and about the world and that you've had laughs as well as tears along the way. I'm really proud of you for taking on such an ambitious, emotional piece of work."







Congratulations to all who were involved in the show. Cable Street is being performed at Arts Depot theatre in Finchley next Tuesday 26th April. The show is now sold out.
