#### **Year 13 Mocks Period - Plan for Lesson Times**

The Year 13 mocks follow a two week Christmas break. As such, we want students to be in school and regularly engaging with their teachers during their mock exam period. Students are expected to attend all lessons unless they have an exam. This is a change to previous years, and is happening to enable all students to have access to their teachers as they prepare for these important exams.

#### Lessons will take place as follows:

- Wed 4th Jan to Fri 6th Jan (before mocks) all students will be present and teachers will use this time as guided revision/exam technique sessions.
- During Mocks Before the subject exam: Guided revision which may include answering some exam-style questions; work on exam technique; 121/group time reviewing students' independent prep revision homework with them
- During Mocks After the subject exam: Supervised revision for other subject exams. Some students
  may wish to ask teachers about their subject exam and those conversations will be helpful.

- From Monday 16<sup>th</sup> January: if no students have exams, A-Level teaching will resume. All students must attend lessons unless they have an exam.
- Year 13 Mock exam season lasts eight school days normal teaching will resume for all subjects by Thursday 19<sup>th</sup> January.
