# Fortismere Family Food Corner—Ms Bhambra

Introducing the Fortismere Family Food Corner, the idea behind this is that parents, careers and pupils can get together and cook a meal. The hope is that this will bring the family together as well as help our pupils to build on their cooking skills as well as their confidence. Cooking is an important life skill that we all need to know!

All the recipes featured will either be existing recipes that have been adapted or simplified for the whole family to follow or secret family recipes from the staff at Fortismere. So I start this off with one of my family favourites – Lamb Keema & Naan.

#### Lamb Keema

Ingredients 250g mince lamb or soya mince 200g tinned tomatoes 1 large onion 75g frozen peas 20g fresh coriander 5cm ginger 3 garlic cloves 1-2 green chillies 15g butter 1tbsp olive oil 1tsp cumin seeds 1 tsp garam masala <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> tsp crushed fenugreek seeds <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> tsp turmeric powder 1 black cardamom 2 cloves 1/4 tsp black pepper 1/4 tsp salt



#### Method

Peel and finely chop the onion, ginger, garlic and chillies.

Heat the oil and butter in a saucepan until the butter has melted and is sizzling.

Add the cumin seeds, crushed fenugreek seeds, black cardamom, cloves and the black pepper.

Add the onion, ginger, garlic, chillies and cook until golden brown.

Stir in the rest of the spices.

Add a splash of water and the tomatoes, cook for 2 minutes

Mix in the Mince lamb, reduce the heat to medium and cook for 25 minutes until the lamb is cooked. Stir in the fresh coriander and serve with fresh naan bread or rice.
