Degree Apprenticeships What are they?

A competitive alternative to traditional university routes which allows students to earn a salary while studying for a degree.

These programmes combine practical, on-the-job experience with academic study, typically funded by employers.

Due to their fully funded nature and strong employer links, these apprenticeships are extremely competitive to apply for.



Degree Apprenticeships Example

- Offers degree apprenticeships across 17 different programmes, including: Aerospace, Engineering, Electronics, Finance, Project Management, etc.
- Most 4-5 years including BA/BSc degree
- Starting salary: approx £20,000





Specialist Programmes What are they?

There are a wide range of specialised programmes available in all sorts of fields, however the **Art Foundation** course in particular has been very popular with our students over many years.

The Art Foundation course is a one year course that is free to enrol in. Our students in the past have used completing an Art Foundation course to support their application to other competitive courses in a range of fields.

- It is important to research a range of courses and a range of institutions and think about **aspirational** choices alongside some **safer bets**.

APPLYING TO START UNIVERSITY IN 2026? **PERSONAL STATEMENTS ARE CHANGING** UCAS

Why do you want to study this course or subject?

Show your passion and knowledge for your chosen subject. It lets universities and colleges know why you're a good fit.

2 How have your qualifications and studies helped you prepare for this course or subject? Talk about the skills you've developed in your education, and how they'll help you succeed.

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What else have you done to prepare outside of education, and why are these experiences useful? Reflect on any other activities or personal experiences outside the classroom that make you suited to the course.



EVIDENCE

The new personal statement format puts more emphasis on what you have done over what you write to judge your suitability for the course.

This is also true of applications for degree apprenticeships!

Key Dates and Deadlines

- There are two sets of deadlines to be aware of: the school's deadline and the UCAS deadline.
- The school's deadlines are a little earlier than the UCAS deadline because all applications need to be checked before they can be sent -- and we find a large proportion of applications have errors.
- We also work to ensure all UCAS applications submitted **before** school breaks up at Christmas for two reasons:
- Students who apply early often also receive offers early.
- Over the Christmas break, students can refocus on the most important part of the process -- getting excellent grades!
