

## Assessment Explained

Following the recent round of Progress Point we would like to provide a brief explanation of how to locate the report and what it all means.



In order to view your child's report, go to [www.go4schools.com](http://www.go4schools.com) and click on the Parents Login. If you have forgotten your log in details you can reset it here:

- Once logged in scroll to the bottom of the page and look for the 'Progress and reports' section
- Click on 'View report' and your child's report will appear. It can also be downloaded as a PDF.

For **Key Stage 5** you will see three grades on the report.

1. ALPS Target Grade
2. Progress Point
3. End of Key Stage Prediction

For **Key Stage 4** you will see three grades on the report.

1. EoY 11 Target Grade
2. Progress Point
3. End of Key Stage Prediction

For **Key Stage 3** you will see two grades on the report.

1. EoY 11 Target Grade
2. Progress Point [Year 9 also receive a Grade]

### ALPS Target Grade

Yr12 and Yr13 students have been set a target for each of their subjects based on their GCSE results. We use a system called ALPS which sets the targets against what the top 25% of schools achieve with students of the same GCSE results. Although aspirational, previous year's data would suggest that student can exceed these grades.

### End of Year 11 Target (EOY 11)

Each student gets an individual end of Yr11 target for each of their subjects based on their Ks2 prior data (which is what the government measure schools' and students' progress against). If all the students were to achieve these targets that should place the school's results in the top 5% nationally for progress. We chose to use Fischer Family Trust to set out targets for us as they make their calculations based on the national data set <https://fft.org.uk/the-fft-story/>

### Progress Point

This is the grade a student is currently performing at and is based on the assessment of everything that they have been taught so far in their lessons. This will be largely linked with a student's mock exam grades or in Key Stage 3 an assessed piece of work.

In Years 7-9 students will have a comment stating whether the student is 'Above Target', 'On Target' or 'Working towards target'.

This statement refers to how a student is performing in relation to the expected level of for someone of their ability and age in order to meet their target.

### Predicted Grade

This grade is the impression the teacher has at this moment of a student's work, attitude, ability, skills and knowledge from all the evidence the student has produced both in and out of the class. At each Progress Point the Predicted Grade may change as students' performance improves throughout their time at Fortismere School.

### Missing Target Grades?

If your child has N/A in the EoY11 Target Grade column then it probably means we don't have Key Stage 2 data for your child at present.
