All year 12 students should now have been added to the **Year 12** (2021-22) Google Classroom. All subject classes have a dedicated classroom where homework and additional work will be set.


Teaching and learning

- Most students study 3 A Level subjects or 1 Extended BTEC diploma.

- All students will have two dedicated study periods on their timetable (by half-term at the latest).

- Expectation to complete homework and independent study on top of lessons.

Facilities


- Dedicated study room
