



- Home school to be given weekly attendance report and involved in decisions moving forwards







Qualifications

1. GCSE English and Maths

Functional Skills English, Maths, An alternative to the GCSE route, Functional Skills offer learners a vocational pathway into English and maths with the flexibility to sit their assessment all year round.

Is functional skills equivalent to a GCSE?

Functional Skills are recognised GCSE alternative qualifications, with a Functional Skills Level 2 course being equivalent to a GCSE grade 4
On demand assessment

2. GCSE Combined Science

Entry level Science Accredited sections

This would allow for particular sections to be taken as an accredited course.

3. BTEC Work Skills Level1/2

equivalent to 1 GCSE – looking at Interview techniques, applications, types of work etc...

4. F/HPQ level 2 equal to a 1/2 GCSE




Finch is a calm and caring environment with a focus on student centred learning and flexibility, classes are small and we pride ourselves on building excellent relationships with students, parents and schools – we are good communicators.

Yr 10 / Yr 11

- A 2 year program but with the added benefit of students being able to apply and join throughout KS4, should there be spaces available.
- Students will be taught in classrooms by specialist Maths, English and Science teachers.
- Alongside the core subjects there will be a GCSE level Work Skills programme offering students the
 opportunity to study the world of work and it's associated skills. It is anticipated that the course will offer
 the students the opportunity to build and develop their own interests, particularly in the world of work with
 the prospect of work experience in their chosen field too.
- Students will also work on an F/HPQ level 2 which amounts to ½ GCSE and have the opportunity to complete unit awards and short courses dependant on their attendance and attitude to learning.
- By narrowing our curriculum to three core GCSEs, a potential level 2 course, dependent on previous academic scores, and a HPQ, we believe that the students will be given the tools to progress to post 16 and possible level 2/3 courses in local colleges.
- Careers and post 16 will be advised on throughout the course

Our offer to students also includes courses on emotional resilience, living healthy lifestyles, positive character building, a PSHE programme, career advice and encouraging aspirational attitudes by exposing students to local business for trips and understanding of the world of work. This will include the wider context of using London to engage in real world learning,
